Andrea Booker is the Program Manager for the Partnership for Maternal and Child Health of Northern New Jersey's (Partnership's) Fetal Infant Mortality Review (FIMR). In this role, she manages multidisciplinary case review teams and guides fetal and infant death examination and analysis of maternal interviews, social service records, and medical records. She is a frequent presenter on the topic of perinatal grief and professional support.

Pamela Caine

Pamela Caine is an activist and parent mentor in the perinatal bereavement space. Since 1996, she has been promoting compassionate care for families who have experienced the loss of a child through pregnancy loss, still birth or newborn death by fundraising, advising, and serving as an organizer and mentor for Englewood Health and Hackensack University Medical Center, and as a peer contact for the SIDS Center of NJ. Her work as a volunteer is inspired by the life and loss of her son, Griffin Matthew.

Paul Caine

Paul Caine is President of On Location, the premier experiences leader and official partner of the NFL, acquired by sports and entertainment leader Endeavor in 2020. He and his wife Pamela are founders of Griffin Cares, in honor of their son Griffin, in support of families that have experienced the loss of a child.

Stacey Dinburg is the vice president and cofounder of The 2 Degrees Foundation. As a stillbirth parent advocate, speaker, and instructional facilitator, Stacey works to raise stillbirth awareness through research and education. She is dedicated to improving how society views and deals with stillbirth.

Vu-An Foster is the Founder, Chief Executive Officer, and President of Life After 2 Losses, an organization with the mission to support, inform, and empower women and mothers through advocacy and education. She has her Bachelors of Science Degree in Public Health and is currently studying for her Master of Public Health Degree at Rutgers School of Public Health.
